CHICAGO SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS

A SUMMARY FOR CANDIDATES IN THE 2024 GENERAL ELECTION

- In the November 5, 2024, General Election, one person shall be elected to represent each of the 10 new Chicago *elected* school board subdistricts. Each person will serve a two-year term beginning January 15, 2025. The mayor shall also appoint one person to represent each of the 10 new Chicago *appointed* school board subdistricts for 2-year terms. In the 2026 General Election, all 20 members of the school board shall be elected.¹
 - The Chicago Board of Elections has published maps of the new school board districts on this page of its website: <u>https://www.chicagoelections.gov/districts-maps/legislative-maps</u>
 - The Illinois State Board of Elections is also required to prepare and publish metes and bounds descriptions of the school board districts.²
- Nominating petition <u>circulation period</u> = March 26, 2024, through June 24, 2024.³
- <u>Signature requirement</u>
 - \circ 1,000 3,000 of the registered voters residing in the district in which the candidate is seeking election.⁴
- **Petition** <u>filing period</u> = June 17 24, 2024.⁵
- Candidate eligibility
 - U.S. Citizen;
 - Registered voter (must be 18 years old by the date of the general election);
 - Resident of the school board district in which the candidate is seeking office for a period of one year immediately before the election;
 - Shall not be a child sex offender as defined in Section 11-9.3 of the Illinois Criminal Code of 2012 (720 ILCS 5/11-9.3); and
 - Must comply with Section 10-9 of the Illinois School Code (105 ILCS 5/10-9).⁶
- **Vacancies** in the elected offices shall be filled for the remainder of the term by majority vote of the remaining members of the Board of Education.⁷
- Apparent Conformity = "The board of election commissioners shall receive and file only those petitions that include a statement of candidacy, the required number of voter signatures, the notarized signature of the petition circulator, and a receipt from the county clerk showing the candidate has filed a statement of economic interests on or before the last day to file..."⁸
- Sample/template nomination papers are available from the State Board of Elections.⁹
